Immediately following the Annual Landowners' Meeting, a Regular Board Meeting will be held for the purpose of addressing any business which may properly come before the Board.

Board. The meetings are open to the public and will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Florida law. The meetings may be continued as found necessary to a time and place specified on the record. If any person decides to appeal any decision made with respect to any.

decision made with respect to any matter considered at these meet-ings, such person will need a record of the proceedings and such person may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceeding is made at his or her own expense and which record includes the testimony and evidence on which the appeal is based.

SPECIAL DISTRICT (CDD) ELECTION PROCEDURES

1. Landowners' Meeting

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, it is required that an initial meeting of the Landowners of the District be held within ninety (90) days following the effective date of the rule or ordinance establishing the District and thereafter every two years during the month of November for the purpose of electing Supervisors. The second election by landowners shall be held on the first Tuesday in November; thereafter, there shall be an election of supervisors every two years in November on a date established by the Board of Supervisors. The assembled Landowners shall organize by electing a Chairperson, who shall preside over the meeting; and a Secretary shall also be elected for recording purposes.

2. Establishment of Quorum

Any Landowner(s) present or voting by proxy shall constitute a quorum at the meeting of the Landowners.

3. Nomination of Candidates

At the meeting, the Chairperson shall call for nominations from the floor for Candidates for the Board of Supervisors. When there are no further nominations, the Chairperson shall close the floor for nominations. The names of each Candidate and the spelling of their names shall be announced. Nominees need not be present to be nominated.

4. Voting

Each Landowner shall be entitled to cast one vote for each acre (or lot parcel), or any fraction thereof, of land owned by him or her in the District, for each open position on the Board. (For example, if there are three positions open, an owner of one acre or less (or one lot parcel) may cast one vote for each of the three positions. An owner of two acres (or two lot parcels) may cast two votes for each of the three positions.) Each Landowner shall be entitled to vote either in person or by a representative present with a lawful written proxy.

5. <u>Registration for Casting Ballots</u>

The registration process for the casting of ballots by Landowners or their representatives holding their proxies shall be as follows:

a) At the Landowners' Meeting and prior to the commencement of the first casting of ballots for a Board of Supervisor position, each Landowner, or their representative if proxies are being submitted in lieu thereof, shall be directed to register their attendance and the total number of votes by acreage (or lot parcels) to which each claims to be entitled, with the elected Secretary of the meeting or the District's Manager.

- b) At such registration, each Landowner, or their representative with a lawful proxy, shall be provided a numbered ballot for the Board of Supervisor position(s) open for election. A District representative will mark on the ballot the number of votes that such Landowner, or their representative, is registered to cast for each Board of Supervisor position open for election.
- c) All Landowner proxies shall be collected at the time of registration and retained with the Official Records of the District for subsequent certification or verification, if required.

6. Casting of Ballots

Registration and the issuance of ballots shall cease once the Chairperson calls for the commencement of the casting of ballots for the election of a Board of Supervisor and thereafter no additional ballots shall be issued.

The Chairperson will declare that the Landowners, or their representatives, be requested to cast their ballots for the Board of Supervisor(s). Once the ballots have been cast, the Chairperson will call for a collection of the ballots.

7. Counting of Ballots

Following the collection of ballots, the Secretary or District Manager shall be responsible for the tabulation of ballots in order to determine the total number of votes cast for each candidate that is seeking election.

At the second and subsequent landowner elections*, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes will be declared by the Chairperson as elected to the Board of Supervisors for four-year terms. The candidate receiving the next highest number of votes will fill the remaining open position on the Board of Supervisors for a two-year term, as declared by the Chairperson.

* At the final landowner election (*after the 6th or 10th year*), the candidate receiving the highest number of votes will be elected to the Board of Supervisors for a four-year term (two supervisors are elected by General Election).

8. <u>Contesting of Election Results</u>

Following the election and announcement of the votes, the Chairperson shall ask the Landowners present, or those representatives holding proxies for Landowners, whether they wish to contest the election results. If no contests are received, said election results shall thereupon be certified.

If there is a contest, the contest must be addressed to the Chairperson and thereupon the individual casting a ballot that is being contested will be required to provide proof of ownership of the acreage for which they voted at the election within five (5) business days of the Landowners' Meeting. The proof of ownership shall be submitted to the District Manager who will thereupon consult with the District's General Counsel and together they will review the material provided and will determine the legality of the contested ballot(s). Once the contests are resolved, the Chairperson shall reconvene the Landowners' Meeting and thereupon certify the election results.

9. Recessing of Annual Landowners' Meeting

In the event there is a contest of a ballot or of the election, the Landowners' Meeting shall be recessed to a future time, date and location, at which time the election findings on the contest shall be reported in accordance with the procedure above and the newly elected Supervisor(s) shall thereupon take their Oath of Office.

10. Miscellaneous Provisions

- a) Each Landowner shall only be entitled to vote in person or by means of a representative attending in person and holding a lawful written proxy in order to cast said Landowner's votes.
- b) Proxies will not require that proof of acreage (or lot parcel) ownership be attached. Rather, proof of ownership must be provided timely by the holder of the proxy, if the proxy is contested in accordance with the procedure above.

DELTA FARMS WATER CONTROL DISTRICT LANDOWNERS' MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 19, 2023

A. CALL TO ORDER

District Manager Frank Sakuma called the December 19, 2023, Landowners' Meeting of the Delta Farms Water Control District (the "District") to order at 9:10 a.m. in the Offices of Collins Brown Barkett, Chartered located at 756 Beachland Boulevard, Vero Beach, Florida 32963.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

Mr. Sakuma presented proof of publication that notice of the Landowners' Meeting had been published in the *Indian River Press Journal* on October 6, 2023, as required by law.

C. ESTABLISH QUORUM

Mr. Sakuma stated that the attendance of Cynthia Colella, a landowner in the District, constituted a quorum and it was in order for the meeting to continue. Also in attendance were proxy holders for Gator ECP LLC and Riverbridge Farms LLC.

D. CONSIDER ADOPTION OF ELECTION PROCEDURES

The election procedures were adopted, as presented, without objection.

E. ELECTION OF CHAIR FOR LANDOWNERS' MEETING

Frank Sakuma was elected as the Chair for the Landowners' Meeting.

F. ELECTION OF SECRETARY FOR LANDOWNERS' MEETING

Stephanie Brown was elected as the Secretary for the Landowners' Meeting.

G. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes of the Annual Landowner's Meeting of December 20, 2022

The December 20, 2022, the Annual Landowner's Meeting minutes were approved as presented.

H. ELECTION OF SUPERVISORS

1. Determine Number of Voting Units Represented or Assigned by Proxy

There were 659 voting units represented or assigned by proxy.

2. Nomination of Supervisors

Mr. Dooley was nominated to remain in his same seat, which is expiring/vacant. No other nominations were offered.

3. Casting of Ballots

Mr. Tooley received 659 votes.

4. Ballot Tabulation & Result

Based on the votes cast, it was determined that Mr. Tooley would receive a 3-year term, expiring in December 2026. There were no objections to the ballots. Mr. Sakuma certified the results.

I. OTHER BUSINESS

1. Treasurer's Report

Mr. Sakuma advised that the Treasurer's Report was included in the Board package. He noted financial information about the District was available, at any time, to Supervisors and landowners. Also, the most recent financial audit was posted on the District's website.

2. Engineer's Report

Tyler Spencer provided the Board with a hard copy handout of the 2023 Engineer's Report and went over highlights of the report.

J. LANDOWNERS' COMMENTS

There were no comments from the landowners.

K. ADJOURN

The Landowners' Meeting was adjourned at 9:29 a.m. There were no objections.

A. CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Board Meeting of November 19, 2024, of the Delta Farms Water Control District (the "District") was called to order at 8:18 a.m. in the offices of Carter Associates located at 1708 21st Street, Vero Beach, Florida 32960.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

Proof of publication was presented, showing that notice of the Regular Board Meeting had been published in the *Indian River Press Journal* on September 30, 2024, as legally required.

C. ESTABLISH A QUORUM

Mr. Sakuma stated that the attendance of Supervisors Tim Dooley, Brian Randolph and Rusty Banack constituted a quorum, allowing the meeting to proceed.

Also present were District Managers Frank Sakuma and Stephanie Brown from Special District Services, as well as District Engineer Tyler Spencer from Carter Associates.

D. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO AGENDA

There were no additions or deletions to the agenda.

E. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

No members of the public offered comments.

F. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. October 15, 2024, Regular Board Meeting

A **motion** to approve the minutes of the October 15, 2024, Regular Board Meeting minutes was made by Mr. Dooley and seconded by Mr. Randolph. The **motion** passed unanimously.

G. **REPORTS**

1. Treasurer

Mr. Banack reviewed the financial data provided in the Board packet and discussed potential options for reallocating funds in the money market account.

Following further discussion, a **motion** to approve the Treasurer's Report dated November 19, 2024, was made by Mr. Dooley and seconded by Mr. Randolph. The **motion** passed unanimously.

2. Engineer

Mr. Spencer provided updates on the following matters:

- The delivery and installation date for the remote rain gauges is still pending.
- Repairs to the fuel line at Pump Station B have been completed.
- The east pump station is not reporting operational hours.
- Significant erosion has been observed along Canal B.

Mr. Banack also reported a leak at Intake A. Mr. Spencer stated he is working on a solution to block the reservoir flow to facilitate repairs.

Additionally, Mr. Banack inquired about the status of motor rebuilds. Mr. Randolph noted that no motors have been rebuilt yet to match the required size. Mr. Banack suggested pulling a motor from Pump Station A for rebuilding.

There was no report from the Attorney.

4. Chairman

I. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider Resolution No. 2024-06 Adopting a Fiscal Year 2024/2025 Amended Budget
